Following are the proposed minutes of September's Rindge Economic Development Task Force meeting:

Date and Time: September 14, 2015; Call to Order at 8:35 a.m.

Announcements:

Roberta Oeser updated the task force on the Kinder-Morgan pipeline, specifically meetings with our governor and certain Federal elected officials. Most seem to be listening.

Approval of Minutes:

Candice Starrett reminded the Chair that she was at the previous meeting in June, but her name wasn't included in the meeting minutes under "Members Present". Motion made by Jed Brummer to approve June 8, 2015 minutes, as amended. Seconded by Roberta Oeser. Motion approved 4-0.

New Business:

EDTF Membership - Jed Brummer has agreed to be appointed a member of the task force. Action requires Planning Board approval. Chair to request this item to be included in an upcoming Planning Board agenda.

EDTF Goals - It was decided to proceed updating the action plan as scheduled and possibly set aside a separate date to meet when the entire action plan update is completed.

Other Business:

Trail mapping update. Roberta Oeser stated that Rick Donovan needed maps modified because of proprietary data and that issue has been addressed. Lisa Murray of Franklin Pierce University is still available to finish the project's graphics. Bethany Paquin can assist.

Jed Brummer asked how many "summer people" reside in Rindge during the warmer weather. Emergency services, economic impact and other questions remain. Rindge Fourth Street residents (along with Beauvais Point Lane) who mostly receive mail through the Winchendon, MA postal office and Rindge Contoocook Lake residents who receive mail through the Jaffrey postal office was briefly discussed.
